'In 1 Samuel, Jesus stands behind every shadow: the promised Anointed of Hannah's song who lifts the lowly and shatters the proud, the true prophet and priest and judge glimpsed in Samuel whose obedience restores what corruption loses, the holy presence that the ark only hinted at, the King Israel longed for but could not imagine. Saul reveals the ruin of splendour without obedience, while David, the humble shepherd anointed by the Spirit, the courageous champion who fights the battle no one else can face, and the merciful exile who refuses to seize power by force, becomes the living silhouette of Christ. Through these stories Jesus appears not by name but by shape, quiet and rising and inevitable.'

OT Narrative:

- Beyond binary character studies... Eli Bad/Samuel Good, Saul Bad/David Good, Be like him...
- Stories for a reason... don't reduce to a series of propositional truths...
- More than telling the story, but not less than telling the story...
- Not <u>History</u>, <u>Former Prophets</u> (Joshua-2 Kings)... Events plus interpretation... Faith-Hope-Love...
- Interchangeable camera lenses...
- Photo Fit of the King... Things can be Jesus(ish)... Messy typology...
- First audience not serialised in the METRO:
 - 1 Samuel 5:5 'This is why the priests of Dagon and all who enter the house of Dagon do not tread on the threshold of Dagon in Ashdod to this day.'
 - 1 Samuel 6:18 ...'The great stone beside which they set down the ark of the Lord is a witness to this day in the field of Joshua of Beth-shemesh.
 - 1 Samuel 9:9 (*Formerly in Israel*, when a man went to inquire of God, he said, "Come, let us go to the seer," for *today's* "prophet" was formerly called a seer.)
 - 1 Samuel 27:6 So that day Achish gave him Ziklag. Therefore Ziklag has belonged to the kings of Judah to this day. (After 931 BC but probably much later...)
 - Careful Edit:
 - 1 Samuel 23 David evades Saul [A]
 - 1 Samuel 24 David spares Saul [B]
 - 1 Samuel 25 David is told not to shed innocent blood [C]
 - 1 Samuel 26 David spares Saul [B']
 - 1 Samuel 27 David evades Saul [A']
 - 1-2 Samuel & 1-2 Kings = 4 Reigns
 - Theological Unity with 1-2 Kings [Covenant Obedience, Prophets vs. Kings, Shared language (1 Sam 15:9 & 2 Kings 21:20), Unbroken Narrative, later Hebrew,
 - Which runs beyond the 37th year of the exile (2 Kings 25:27-30)

Therefore, first audience is probably in and around the exile (6th Century BC)

Therefore though these stories always take place in 'narrative time', we must ask the question what would readers in the exile make of these stories. What would they think, feel, hope for?

'Why did we lose the land and end up in exile if we are God's chosen people? Is there any hope?'

- Whole theological weight of at least Genesis -> Judges under their belt, but probably a lot more...

Joshua 7:1 - But the people of Israel broke faith in regard to the devoted things, for Achan the son of Carmi, son of Zabdi, son of Zerah, of the tribe of Judah, took some of the devoted things. And the anger of the Lord burned against the

1 Chronicles 2:7 - The son of Carmi: Achan, **the troubler of Israel**, who broke faith in the matter of the devoted thing;

- **1 Samuel 14:29-30** Then Jonathan said, "My father has **troubled the land**. See how my eyes have become bright because I tasted a little of this honey. How much better if the people had eaten freely today of the spoil of their enemies that they found. For now the defeat among the Philistines has not been great."
- 1 Samuel 15:26-28 And Samuel said to Saul, "I will not return with you. For you have rejected the word of the Lord, and the Lord has rejected you from being king over Israel." As Samuel turned to go away, Saul seized the skirt of his robe, and it tore. And Samuel said to him, "The Lord has torn the kingdom of Israel from you this day and has given it to a neighbour of yours, who is better than you.
- 1 Samuel 10:20-21 Then Samuel brought all the tribes of Israel near, and the tribe of Benjamin was taken by lot. He brought the tribe of Benjamin near by its clans, and the clan of the Matrites was taken by lot; and Saul the son of Kish was taken by lot. But when they sought him, he could not be found.
- **1 Samuel 15:15 -** Saul said, "They have brought them from the Amalekites, for the people spared the best of the sheep and of the oxen to sacrifice to the Lord your God, and the rest we have devoted to destruction."

A Story between 2 Songs:

1 Samuel 2:1–10 (Hannah's Song) launches the book by declaring that God exalts the humble, brings down the proud, and will raise up His king, while **2 Samuel 22:1–23:7** (David's Song) closes the story by confirming that God has done exactly that. Establishing His anointed king through sovereign reversal and covenant faithfulness.

Melodic Line of 1 Samuel:

'The Sovereign God reshapes Israel according to His promises, moving them towards being a Kingdom under His chosen King, in the process proclaiming that true security and blessing come not from human power but from humble, wholehearted obedience to Him.' (Starter for 10)

Chiasm:

A **chiasm** (or **chiasmus**) is a literary or rhetorical structure in which elements are arranged in a mirrored, inverted pattern—typically described as **A–B–C-B'–A'**. The second half of the passage reverses the order of the first half, creating a symmetrical "X-shaped" structure (from the Greek *chi*, the letter X).

Chiasm is used to highlight contrasts, emphasize key ideas, or create a memorable, balanced expression. For example: "When the going gets tough, the tough get going."

1 SAMUEL 1 - WHEN DESPAIR BECOMES DELIGHT...

AT HOME IN DESPAIR [1-8]

There was a certain man of Ramathaim-zophim of the hill country of Ephraim whose name was Elkanah the son of Jeroham, son of Elihu, son of Tohu, son of Zuph, an Ephrathite. ²He had two wives. The name of one was Hannah, and the name of the other, Peninnah. And Peninnah had children, but Hannah had no children.

³Now this man used to go up year by year from his city to worship and to sacrifice to the Lord of hosts at Shiloh, where the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were priests of the Lord. ⁴On the day when Elkanah sacrificed, he would give portions to Peninnah his wife and to all her sons and daughters. ⁵But to Hannah he gave a double portion, because he loved her, though the Lord had closed her womb. ⁶And her rival used to provoke her grievously to irritate her, because the Lord had closed her womb. ⁷So it went on year by year. As often as she went up to the house of the Lord, she used to provoke her. Therefore Hannah wept and would not eat. ⁸And Elkanah, her husband, said to her, "Hannah, why do you weep? And why do you not eat? And why is your heart sad? Am I not more to you than ten sons?"

AT THE TEMPLE IN DISTRESS [9-18]

⁹After they had eaten and drunk in Shiloh, Hannah rose. Now Eli the priest was sitting on the seat beside the doorpost of the temple of the Lord. ¹⁰ She was deeply distressed and prayed to the Lord and wept bitterly. ¹¹And she vowed a vow and said, "O Lord of hosts, if you will indeed look on the affliction of your servant and remember me and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a son, then I will give him to the Lord all the days of his life, and no razor shall touch his head."

¹²As she continued praying before the Lord, Eli observed her mouth. ¹³Hannah was speaking in her heart; only her lips moved, and her voice was not heard. Therefore Eli took her to be a drunken woman. ¹⁴And Eli said to her, "How long will you go on being drunk? Put your wine away from you." ¹⁵But Hannah answered, "No, my lord, I am a woman troubled in spirit. I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but I have been pouring out my soul before the Lord. ¹⁶Do not regard your servant as a worthless woman, for all along I have been speaking out of my great anxiety and vexation." ¹⁷Then Eli answered, "Go in peace, and the God of Israel grant your petition that you have made to him." ¹⁸And she said, "Let your servant find favour in your eyes." Then the woman went on her way and ate, and her face was no longer sad.

AT HOME IN DELIGHT [19-23]

¹⁹They rose early in the morning and worshipped before the Lord; then they went back to their house at Ramah. And Elkanah knew Hannah his wife, and the Lord remembered her. ²⁰And in due time Hannah conceived and bore a son, and she called his name Samuel, for she said, "I have asked for him from the Lord."

²¹The man Elkanah and all his house went up to offer to the Lord the yearly sacrifice and to pay his vow. ²²But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him, so that he may appear in the presence of the Lord and dwell there for ever."

AT THE TEMPLE IN DEVOTION [24-27]

²³Elkanah her husband said to her, "Do what seems best to you; wait until you have weaned him; only, may the Lord establish his word." So the woman remained and nursed her son until she weaned him. ²⁴And when she had weaned him, she took him up with her, along with a three-year-old bull, an ephah of flour, and a skin of wine, and she brought him to the house of the Lord at Shiloh. And the child was young. ²⁵Then they slaughtered the bull, and they brought the child to Eli. ²⁶And she said, "Oh, my lord! As you live, my lord, I am the woman who was standing here in your presence, praying to the Lord. ²⁷For this child I prayed, and the Lord has granted me my petition

that I made to him. ²⁸Therefore I have lent him to the Lord. As long as he lives, he is lent to the Lord."

And he worshipped the Lord there.



1 SAMUEL 8 - WHEN REQUESTS BECOME REGAL...

When Samuel became old, he made his sons judges over Israel. ²The name of his firstborn son was Joel, and the name of his second, Abijah; they were judges in Beersheba. ³Yet his sons did not walk in his ways but turned aside after gain. They took bribes and perverted justice.

⁴Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah ⁵and said to him, "Behold, you are old and your sons do not walk in your ways. Now appoint for us a king to judge us like all the nations." ⁶But the thing displeased Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to judge us." And Samuel prayed to the Lord. ⁷And the Lord said to Samuel, "Obey the voice of the people in all that they say to you, for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected me from being king over them. ⁸According to all the deeds that they have done, from the day I brought them up out of Egypt even to this day, forsaking me and serving other gods, so they are also doing to you. ⁹Now then, obey their voice; only you shall solemnly warn them and show them the ways of the king who shall reign over them."

¹⁰So Samuel told all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking for a king from him. ¹¹He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen and to run before his chariots. ¹²And he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest, and to make his implements of war and the equipment of his chariots. ¹³He will take your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers. ¹⁴He will take the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his servants. ¹⁵He will take the tenth of your grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and to his servants. ¹⁶He will take your male servants and female servants and the best of your young men and your donkeys, and put them to his work. ¹⁷He will take the tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. ¹⁸And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the Lord will not answer you in that day."

¹⁹But the people refused to obey the voice of Samuel. And they said, "No! But there shall be a king over us, ²⁰that we also may be like all the nations, and that our king may judge us and go out before us and fight our battles." ²¹And when Samuel had heard all the words of the people, he repeated them in the ears of the Lord. ²²And the Lord said to Samuel, "Obey their voice and make them a king." Samuel then said to the men of Israel, "Go every man to his city."

Deuteronomy 17:14-20

14"When you come to the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you possess it and dwell in it and then say, 'I will set a king over me, like all the nations that are around me,' ¹⁵you may indeed set a king over you whom the Lord your God will choose. One from among your brothers you shall set as king over you. You may not put a foreigner over you, who is not your brother. ¹⁶Only he must not acquire many horses for himself or cause the people to return to Egypt in order to acquire many horses, since the Lord has said to you, 'You shall never return that way again.' ¹⁷And he shall not acquire many wives for himself, lest his heart turn away, nor shall he acquire for himself excessive silver and gold.

Now the Philistines gathered their armies 17 for battle. And they were gathered at Socoh, which belongs to Judah, and encamped between Socoh and Azekah, in Ephes-dammim. ²And Saul and the men of Israel were gathered, and encamped in the Valley of Elah, and drew up in line of battle against the Philistines. 3And the Philistines stood on the mountain on the one side, and Israel stood on the mountain on the other side, with a valley between them. 4And there came out from the camp of the Philistines a champion named Goliath of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span. 5He had a helmet of bronze on his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail, and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of bronze. ⁶And he had bronze armour on his legs, and a javelin of bronze slung between his shoulders. 7The shaft of his spear was like a weaver's beam, and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron. And his shield-bearer went before him. 8He stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel, "Why have you come out to draw up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and are you not servants of Saul? Choose a man for yourselves, and let him come down to me. 9If he is able to fight with me and kill me, then we will be your servants. But if I prevail against him and kill him, then you shall be our servants and serve us." 10And the Philistine said, "I defy the ranks of Israel this day. Give me a man, that we may fight together." 11When Saul and all Israel heard these words of the Philistine, they were dismayed and greatly afraid.

¹²Now David was the son of an Ephrathite of Bethlehem in Judah, named Jesse, who had eight sons. In the days of Saul the man was already old and advanced in years. ¹³The three oldest sons of Jesse had followed Saul to the battle. And the names of his three sons who went to the battle were Eliab the firstborn, and next to him Abinadab, and the third Shammah. ¹⁴David was the youngest. The three eldest followed Saul, ¹⁵but David went back and forth from Saul to feed his father's sheep at Bethlehem. ¹⁶For forty days the Philistine came forward and took his stand, morning and evening.

¹⁷And Jesse said to David his son, "Take for your brothers an ephah of this parched grain, and these ten loaves, and carry them quickly to the camp to your brothers. ¹⁸Also take these ten cheeses to the commander of their thousand. See if your brothers are well, and bring some token from them."




